## **OUTREACH NEWS**

You are a loving, generous congregation and working with you makes our outreach to the community an exciting adventure. brought us lots of quality clothing, many new items. We had beautiful old glassware donated by a neighbor that was sold at attractive prices. Workers in the area added for the first time a donation box in the clothing area. Surprisingly there was a total of \$87.15 received for sales and donations. We will return to giving all items away in November to food pantry patrons. We are grateful for your extreme generosity! Special thanks to Janet Coffelt, Carolyn Goldman and Barbara Lo for coordinating the clothing area and sale items.

The Second Saturday in October is the Fall Festival and we worked with Nancy Gray to make it a spectacular event for the community. Outreach coordinated the following activities: MedStar Montgomery free flu shots, Cookie decorations, and spider pops by Ranudi a n d Isan Kadithuwokku and Sharon Perera; exotic face painting by Bambi Blackwell and the greatest slime in Aspen Hill by Erin and Colleen Kelly, graduates of our pre-school. They all were very professional and worked non-stop during the day even though Erin and Sharon were too young for SSL hours. Other activities included pumpkin

decoration, games, UMW bake and jewelry sale, UMM grilled hamburgers and hot dogs and more.

FOOD PANTRY. The food pantry served seventy families reaching 171 adults and 146 children, totaling 317 persons. Thanks to the Middle & High School Sunday School class for set-up.

COMMUNITY MINISTRIES volunteers provided information on the Kasey Health Clinic and health and nutrition issues in Spanish and English.

MUM'S (Mid-County United Ministries) provided food from our parking lot October I.

SMART SACKS under the leadership of Nancy Gray provided 192 families at Wheaton Woods making a total of outreach to 384 families this school year. Together Smart Sacks and the food pantry has reached 521 families this school year.

FRESH BREAD and SPIR-ITUAL NOURISHMENT made apple pull apart bread and explored the topic of being real and transformative love from the story of the story of the Velveteen Rabbit. The next meeting will be November 18.

NOVEMBER is the MONTH of THANKSGIV-ING however, we proudly proclaim that Millian does not wait for this season to think of our neighbors who

need assistance. We will provide Thanksgiving Food. We will work again with Linkages to Learning to do the screening and delivery. We do not have data on families that come to the food pantry. Some food bags are reserved for Millian's discretion. Let us know if there are families you would like to receive Thanksgiving Food. will immediately start our outreach and expand it to groups that are using our facility to also contribute.

We encourage you to continue support for the food pantry. We are buying more food. Food purchases were more than \$600 in October and 70 bags of food were received by our neighbors the 2nd Saturday. We prepare 60 bags of food per month. A contribution of about \$13.00 will purchase a bag of food. Please note on your check, "Food Pantry". We'll put a display in the narthex to increase your awareness of what the bag is like. Again, we thank you for your donations of food and funds.

autodisciplina y nos permite alimentar nuestra opulencia.
