Time to rest, get up and walk

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ of the great family in the United Methodist Church of Millian, we have at the door events of great importance for the life of our church; but let me focus on the celebration of Lent, which invites us to rest and prepare for forty days for what we call Holy Week, beginning with Holy Thursday, when lesus dines with His disciples and marks us with the washing of feet, and on Friday it is the sacrifice of lesus for us all, and culminate in a glorious resurrection. But we cannot avoid or forget all the stages in this process.

The Rev. Dr. Zina Jacque invited us to rest is an invitation, so that we can be ready for what God is calling us, rest and reflect, and be ready to listen to the voice of God for us as a family of faith in Millian.

Precisely at this time we are already at the door of having within reach of all the strategic plan in which we have been working since last year. Let us be ready in prayer, fasting and new energies for the challenge that God has for us.

To finish I leave another contribution of the Rev. Dr. Zina Jacque that will help us enormously in this process of 40 days of Lent.

As we walked with "it's enough"

The number 40 is used almost 150 times in the biblical text. It means, among other things, **sufficient**.

- 40days and 40nights as Noah and his family watched for the arc.
- Moses spent 40 days in Mt. Sinai receiving God's guidance.
- Joshua and those sent to spy out the promised land spent 40 days seeking and understanding regarding the place they were to receive as an inheritance
- Coliath Stood in the valley between Socoh and Azekah and threatened Saul and all Israel for 40 days.
- Ezekiel stretched out on his side for 40 days,

- as he bore the sins of the house of ludah.
- Jonah cried out for 40 days calling Ninevah to repentance.
- Jesus stayed 40 days in the wilderness, alone, tempted and tried.
- The number of days from the time of Jesus resurrection until his ascension was 40 days.

We have 40 days to:

Rest Rise

Walk

Into the hope and love that the one we follow has promised.

OUTREACH NEWS

2ND SATURDAY

Thanks to you and the community we had a large supply of winter wear available for families. St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church donated about 15 jackets and sweaters, lap blankets, scarves and several carts of food. Med-Star Montgomery provided screening and counseling for cholesterol, Hypertension and glucose. Community Ministry provided information about Casey Health clinic and signed persons up for an exercise walk in April. Children made Valentines on pencils.

Fifty-seven families received food representing 119 adults and 120 children; totaling an outreach to 239 persons. The food pantry ministry in 2017 has reached 122 families and 532 persons.

29 volunteers provided services for 2nd Saturday in February; 5 staff and volunteers from other agencies, 6 adults from Millian and 4 youth, 2 parents and 12 other community youth receiving SSL hours.

2nd MILE GIVING

Thank you for your donations to 2nd Mile Giving. The administrative board approved in the lanuary meeting to donate \$1,000 to Casey Health Clinic of Community Ministries of Rockville and \$500.00 to the Thomas Technology High Edison School. Community Ministries of Rockville offers a myriad of programs and housing for marginal families. Thomas Edison Center is offering a new program, Ca-

Readiness Education reer Academy (CREA) for students who will not graduate before turning 21. This evening program allows students to work during the day while earning a GED diploma in the evening. They also are gaining valuable work skills in Carpentry, Electricity, Heating, Ventilation and Air Con-Masonry and ditioning, Plumbing. Our donation will support students in carpentry with basic equipment for their tool box.

EQUIPMENT for THOM-AS **EDISON** HIGH SCHOOL of TECHNOLO-GΥ CARPENTRY PRO-GRAM. The first supplies were picked up for the program 2/15. Thank you for your donations! There is box in the narthex and the Chapel Room to collect tools. The boxes will remain in place as long as needed. The items you no longer use will be a valuable gift to students who need a tool box for their studies in carpentry. **SMART** SACKS for WHEATON WOODS ELE-MENTARY SCHOOL

Nancy Gray, Coordinator packed food for 4 weeks, 48 bags per week for 192 families. The Smart Sack program has reached 432 families in 2017. Smart Sacks and the food pantry have provided food for 5554 families in 2017.

Community Partners under the leadership of Marguerite Eimer sponsored their annual Martin Luther Service Day at Millian Church. We had a large crowd of adults, and children giving back to the community. Students in middle and high school earned SSL hours. Volunteers from Millian, St. John's, the library and staff from Linkages to Learning and the Arc provided leadership along with parent helpers for the event. A new pair of socks packed with personal care items was donated to approximately 70 persons in the men and women shelters, snack packs for the fire department on Bel Pre Road, Valentine on pencils for Genesis Rest Home on Bel Pre Road and magnets for the Wheaton Fire Department. A fun and productive day for all who participated.
