My beloved family in faith, my brothers and sisters in the church of Millian UMC:

The Christmas season is a time of hope and we reaffirm that salvation has come for everyone, for all who accept the baby born in Bethlehem, our Lord Jesus Christ. We have affirmed that we do not wish to die as a church, and this is possible under the direction of the Holy Spirit. Our faith is being exercised in this process, where patience and perseverance are fundamental elements and coexist. In the same way that God did not stop loving and remained faithful to that love for us his creation, we must remain in our faith and in the promises that God has given us.

We continue to use the protocols (discipline of the United Methodist Church) established to make our decisions. We remain true to our Wesleyan tradition. We have advanced slowly, but advanced, and I want to share with you precisely these

advances:

I. It was successfully implemented to suspend the extended practice of offering for restricted funds guiding the members to offer for general fund.

2. It has now been decided to pay our apportionments to the extent of the availability of our financial resources.

3. The position of the music director and our custodian was redefined, which is directly reflected in our budget.

4. The sale of our van was approved and made, money that was channeled to our general fund.

5. A real budget was drawn up where our ministries that we currently have as a summer Bible school (VBS), food ministry, youth, fall festival, among others, are being considered, emphasizing the outreach to the community.

6. We worked on a proposal for the conference where we defined that we can only pay 50% of the salary of a full-time pastor. (documentation is attached) along with

the amount that we require monthly to cover our commitments.

7. From here until June 2019 the church is responsible for the package that was approved for the pastor. As of July 2019, the decision of the pastor to be assigned to Millian is in the hands of the conference.

33 But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. (Matthew 6:33 NIV). We must focus on what God asks of us, and in his time he will give us what we need, not in our time, so let us be patient, and learn the times of God.

God sent his son for the salvation of our souls and of the whole world. Jesus stripped himself of his divinity out of love for us. That God so loving, that Jesus so obedient to the voice of his father, invites us to continue trusting and follow the example of obedience founded on love.

Let us be faithful and not stop committing ourselves in the church where God called us to participate, with our offerings, tithe and our time. Your church counts on you in this effort. For this reason we add in this letter the pledge card and a gift card, please answer them and send it to the church to be considered.

The child is born and walks with us, we do not lose faith and we increase our patience.

25, 50, 75 PERCENT?

The problem is complicated by the fact that (presumably) in 2019, we will have full time Pastor (Pastor Balderas) for 6 months then an assumed pastor at 50% of the cost of a Senior Pastor for the latter 6 months. That case works out to 75% of the cost of a Senior Pastor for that year.

This information will be a starting point for a formal response to the District/ Conference on what Millian can afford with the objective of also paying apportionments in the future. "Reaching and building up ALL people for CHRIST".

A few notes:

- I) The Preaching & Pastoral figure for 2019 represents 1/2 year x our Pastors total package + 1/2 year @ 1/2 of our Pastors total package. The year 2019 also includes the dollars that we currently owe for Pastor Balderas pension and medical insurance costs.
- 2) The Finance total includes final 2019 apportionments of \$55,717.
- 3) The average monthly income that would be required to pay \$361,615 in expenses in 2019 is \$30,135. The monthly amount required to pay \$318,000 in expenses is \$26,500. In 2018, through September, we are averaging income of \$25,600 per month
- 4) The only way I see to reduce expenses to match expected income in 2019 is to begin the year [not] paying any of our apportionments.
